4. JERUSALEM

Ever since its foundation in 1987, the Question of Jerusalem has been a primary focus of PASSIA's activities. Besides hosting meetings, projects include academic research, documentation, publication and cooperation with other institutions to increase both awareness and knowledge concerning the various aspects of the Holy City.

Over the years, Palestinian, Israeli, and foreign speakers from a variety of backgrounds (including scholars and academics, representatives from the three monotheistic religions, political figures, diplomats and visiting scholars or researchers) have been invited to give presentations and encourage debate on the issues at hand.

PASSIA projects intend to facilitate the exchange of information, to identify various needs and interests in the city and to encourage the development of possible future scenarios. These goals, in turn, have led to the discussion of a broad range of topics, including infrastructure, demographic and geopolitical issues, settlements and land use, 'absentee property', the Old City, religion and religious affiliation with the city, Israeli institutions, and future scenarios for the status of the city.

SEMINAR

As part of its activities on the occasion of "Al-Quds – Capital of Arab Culture 2009", PASSIA organized and implemented an intensive three-day **seminar on Jerusalem**, which targeted an audience of young educators, professionals and activists with a need and desire to gain a profound background and knowledge in the issues that make up the "Jerusalem Question".

The training program incorporated introductory material, lectures, discussions, and case studies related to the Jerusalem's history, society, and politics, including examination of issues such as the peace process/negotiations, religious significances, the legal situation of the Palestinians in the city, etc.

The seminar was organized as follows:

(a) Application and Selection of Participants. Six to eight weeks before the actual training seminar took place, it was advertised in the local press. Application forms were available at PASSIA and candidates had two or three weeks to apply. A shortlist of applicants was then invited for interviews, which were – in line with PASSIA's policy - conducted by an external examiner who also selected the participants.

(b) Acceptance. Upon selection, participants were required to state their and their employee's acceptance of the placement in writing. Once the form was returned signed to PASSIA, the participant received preparatory reading material gathered by the PASSIA Project Team in coordination with trainers and lecturers, with the aim to familiarize him/herself with the basic course subjects.

(c) Intensive Training Seminar. Trainees then attended a three-day training course conducted by local experts. Where available or needed, they were given additional study material and examined relevant case studies.

Research work in 2008/09 included the following:



Bulletin – Israeli Settlement Activities and Related Policies in Jerusalem

This Special Bulletin presents the basic facts and figures relating to the issue of settlements as well as the Wall Israel is currently building in and around Jerusalem. It intends to shed some light on certain significant recent events and developments in city, including the growing presence of Israeli settlers in and around the Old City, the expansion of settlements in the wider Jerusalem area, and the impact of the separation barrier - all of which were carefully designed to make any serious discussion relating to the establishment of a future Palestinian capital in Jerusalem impossible.



Special Project

As part of its activities on the occasion of "Al-Quds – Capital of Arab Culture 2009", PASSIA undertook a project, entitled **Cultural Footprints in Jerusalem,** in which the influences of certain nations on the development of Jerusalem's cultural history were presented by native researchers from those countries. The project

aimed at highlighting the major events and contributions that have tied each of those nations to Jerusalem, along with profiles of the people who made them happen. PASSIA believes that this is an opportunity to showcase the relationship that various nations have had with the mosaic of the city, whether that influence is manifested here in Jerusalem or in the country in question. Areas covered included literature, architecture, archaeology, prominent visitors, music, cultural exchanges, special events, visual arts, and institutions.

To date, PASSIA published two monographs, highlighting the major events and contributions that have tied Sweden and Germany to Jerusalem.

To Jerusalem - In the Steps of Eight Swedes and a Finn: a thousand years of reciprocal contributions inspired by the cultural, religious, scientific and political mosaic of Jerusalem/Al Quds.

Germans in Jerusalem 1830-1914

This booklet focuses on one part of the long history of German-Jerusalemite relations; the 70-year period between the founding of the Anglo-Prussian Bishopric and the First World War, the 'golden time of German involvement in Palestine'. To this day, a number of imposing buildings throughout the city stand testament to this era. These include the Hospital of the Empress Auguste Viktoria Stiftung (Augusta Victoria Foundation) on the Mount of Olives, the Redeemer Church near the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in the Old City, the Dormition Abbey on Mount Zion, and the German




Colony, the settlement of members of the Temple Society, which gives a district of West Jerusalem its name. The book examines how the commitment

of a wide range of people, and the way it took shape, can only be understood against the background of the German history of the time. A special focus of this monograph is thereby the journey to and stay in Jerusalem of Kaiser Wilhelm II in 1898 as well as the visit's repercussions, especially its legacy in terms of architecture that can be traced until this day.

Also as part of its activities on the occasion of "Al-Quds – Capital of Arab Culture 2009", PASSIA commissioned the translation (French into Arabic) of a book on the late **Faisal Husseini** and his actions with regard to Jerusalem (see chapter on the **Research Program** for details). In addition, PASSIA has designed, in cooperation with the Palestinian artists Sliman Mansour and Taleb Dweik, and printed three posters on Jerusalem:
