7. TRAINING YOUNG LEADERS – PARTY DEVELOPMENT

The PASSIA project *Training Young Leaders* was developed to empower midcareer Palestinian professionals to deal more effectively with the tasks and specific problems ahead. The overall goal is to prepare future leaders to promote public needs rather than political favors, understand the breadth of perspective on issues, assume responsibility and exercise sound decision-making.

In 2007 PASSIA drew upon its previous experience in conducting training seminars, its record of facilitating the exchange of ideas and promoting dialogue among the various sectors of society, and its extensive research activity on a wide range of issues, and in cooperation with its long-standing partner Friedrich-Ebert Foundation launched a project designed to offer independent assistance in policy and platform development for members of parties, factions and related civic groups.

As part of this program, PASSIA organized and implemented three intensive five-day training programs on **Party Development** in 2008. They intended to establish a general introduction in the field of parties and party systems and to enhance participants' knowledge of party practices in order to foster the institutional development and capacity building of political parties in Palestine. The courses focused on practical training and hands-on exercises in relevant fields and concepts, with an emphasis on the institutional and organizational requirements of parties.

PASSIA believes that such hands-on training in the field of party formation can play an important role in shaping the political debate and in the formation of more programmatically based parties in Palestine, which in turn can act as tools for promoting reform and political development.

The project's overall objectives are thus to develop the internal capacities of parties, to enhance people's participation in the political decision-making process, and to empower of future party leaders.

Course Outline

Prior to each training program PASSIA consulted with colleagues and experts in order to plan and implement the training program. The seminar was advertised in the local press and notification was also given to political movements and parties.

A shortlist of applicants was then invited for interviews. In line with PASSIA's policy not to interfere in the selection process, Dr. Varsen Aghabekian from the *Prime Minister's Office, Ramallah* was invited to conduct the interviews and select the participants for the training program.

From 3-7 April 2008, Experts in the field of party development and politics gave a series of presentations, lectures, and case studies. The participants were

encouraged to relate what they learned to their work in their own movements/factions. At the close of the seminar, participants received an assignment, the completion of which formed an integral part of the overall course.

At the close of the program, participants who performed all required tasks were handed a certificate affirming their successful participation in the training program.

From among the participants who performed all required tasks the most outstanding were selected to undergo a further program, including a field visit to Europe.

Training Programs on Party Development

In 2008, three training programs on Party Development were organized and implemented (a fourth had already taken place in 2007). They all established a general introduction in the field of parties and party systems and focused on the knowledge of party practices needed to foster the institutional development and capacity-building of political parties in Palestine. In addition, each of the training programs emphasized a special aspect of Party Development: the April seminar with a focus on *Strategic Planning*, the July seminar with a focus on *Effective Campaigning*, and the October seminar with a focus on *Party Communications*, *Images and Media Relations*.
