SEMINARS

As part of its project on *Dialogue and Education for a Continued Palestinian Presence in East Jerusalem,* which aimed at providing selected participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to strengthen, keep and develop the existence of Palestinians and their institutions in the city, PASSIA organized and conducted a second training program focusing on media and communication skills (the first one, on Advocacy and Lobbying, took place in 2016).

PASSIA TRAINING PROGRAM ON MEDIA & COMMUNICATION, 16-19 FEBRUARY 2017

The seminar on *Media and Communication* aimed to enhance the capacity and effectiveness of Palestinian activists from Jerusalem to successfully formulate communication and public relations strategies, make winning presentations, plan media events, and communicate effectively.

■ Course Outline

1. Preparation

In November/December 2016, PASSIA began to plan the training program, which was advertised in the local press during January 2017. Notification was also given to national institutions such as NGOs, youth and research centers.

2. Participant Selection Procedure

By the deadline of 25 January 2017, PASSIA had received a large number of applications from all over the Palestinian Territories. Of these, shortlisted candidates were invited for interviews. In line with PASSIA policy not to interfere in the selection process, Mr. Saad Halawani, Society Programme Manager at the British Council, was commissioned to conduct interviews in early February 2017. Altogether, 34 of the applicants were selected to participate in the training program.

3. Reading Period

Following their selection, participants received preparatory reading material to become familiar with the background of the seminar (situation in Jerusalem) beforehand. With this, they also received the following writing assignment that had to be sent to PASSIA by latest 14 February 2017:

Please describe on 1-2 pages (in either Arabic or English) a media/communication-related activity you or your organization have/has participated in or you are otherwise aware of and assess whether or not these were successful and if not, why not.

4. Lecture Program

From 16-19 February 2017 a series of presentations, lectures, workshops and exercises were given by experts in their respective fields. The participants were encouraged to relate what they learned to their own work.

5. Certification

At the close of the program, participants who performed all required tasks received a certificate affirming their successful participation in the training program.
