

Abstract:

What has not yet been studied about Jerusalem?

Jerusalem generates an unending flood of publications with typically dozens of books appearing each year, so one might think that there is not much new to be said about the pre-modern heritage of the city. Nonetheless major areas of primary investigation remain open.

Only a small portion of the pre-modern buildings in the Old City have yet received careful architectural documentation. Most, but not all of the major public monuments have been studied, but only very few of the buildings in the residential neighborhoods. Archaeological excavations will continue unabated far into the future.

Archival documents remain largely unpublished, especially the hundreds of volumes of the Ottoman Islamic law court records (sijills), while archival material about Jerusalem in Istanbul or elsewhere remain largely unexplored.
